

Key Vocabulary

Puritan	A member of a group of English Protestants of the late 16th and 17th centuries.
Protestant	A member of any of the Western Christian Churches that are separate from the Roman Catholic Church.
The Mayflower	Mayflower was an English ship that transported a group of English families, known today as the Pilgrims, from England to the New World in 1620
Pilgrim	One of the people who travelled by boat from England to make a home in New England at Plymouth in 1620.
Wampanoag	A native American people.

1607 John Smith founds the Jamestown settlement. Native peoples bring food to help the colonists. 1616 Smallpox and leptospirosis eradicate the entire native population in New England. 1620 The Mayflower brings Pilgrims from Plymouth, UK to Plymouth, Massachusetts.

1620 John Rolfe marries Pocahontas, the daughter of the Powhatan chief. 1621 Squanto helps enact a peace treaty between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag tribe.
