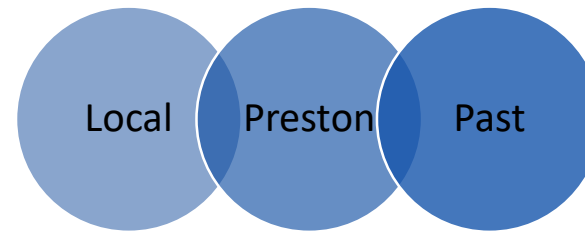


Prior Knowledge

Key Knowledge

- To know that the origin of Preston’s name is Priest’s-tun.
- To know that despite Henry VII’s religious Reformation in the 16th Century most of Preston remained staunchly Catholic.
- Miller Park and Moor Park were opened in 1864 and 1867 respectively.
- During the 19th Century Preston was dominated by cotton.



Key Vocabulary

Priest’s tun	A priest’s farm or estate.
Catholic	A person baptised into the Roman Catholic Christian church which recognises the Pope as its spiritual leader on earth.
Reformation	In England, Henry VIII initiated a break with Rome and formed the basis of Protestantism.
Royalist	Person who supports a particular monarch.
Import	To bring goods to a country from abroad for sale.
Export	To send goods to another country for sale.

1179 Preston is given a charter

1260 Franciscan friars arrive in Preston

1539 King Henry VIII closes the friary

February 1643 During the Civil War Parliamentary troops capture Preston

1771 First cotton mill opens

1792 Canal built from Preston to Lancaster
