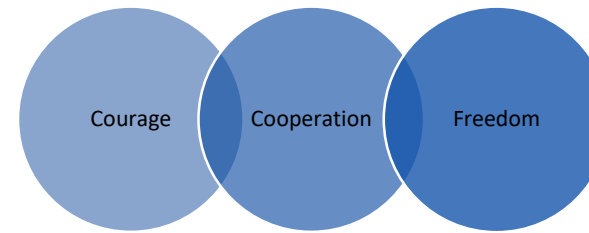


Prior Knowledge

- To know people and places change with time.
- That cities and densely populated places have grown over time from smaller settlements.
- Artefacts, eyewitness accounts and evidence such as newspaper articles can be used to extrapolate historical truth.

Key Knowledge

- World War II started in 1939 and ended in 1945.
- The Leader of Germany, Adolph Hitler had plans to take over many countries.
- He invaded and annexed Austria in March 1938.
- In September 1938 the Munich Agreement was signed by Britain, French, Germany and Italy.
- During World War II over 3.5 million children were evacuated from cities to the country.



Key Vocabulary

Allies	UK, France and Poland later joined by other countries such as USSR, USA and China.
Axis	Originally, Germany, Japan and Italy but were joined by others later.
Conscripted	Required by law to serve their country.
Nazi Party	A German political party with racist anti-Jewish ideas led by Adolph Hitler.
Evacuation	Taking people from a dangerous place to safer one.
Propaganda	Information provided to promote a political idea or opinion
