Attendance

A reminder that **leave in term time** is granted for **exceptional circumstances** only. Unauthorised leave of 5 days or more may attract a penalty notice from LCC. The fine is presented to both parents regardless of who has taken the child/ren out of school. Reminder Regarding Illness and Medication

A child suffering from sickness and diarrhoea should be kept off school for 48 hours after the symptoms subside. If you are in doubt as to whether or not your child is well enough to be in school, please discuss the matter with the class teacher or the headteacher.

Parents/carers are required to contact the school office or class teacher on the first day of absence, advising of the reason for the absence and expected return date; if known.

<u>Medication</u> - Medicines are only to be administered at school when it would be detrimental to a child's health or school attendance not to do so. Parents must complete a form, available, from the school office, prior to medication being left in school.

Where clinically possible, medicines should be prescribed in dose frequencies which enable them to be taken outside school hours. If this is not possible we only accept prescribed medicines that are in-date, labelled, provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include instructions for administration & dosage.

If your child has been prescribed medication then we are happy to support with this however, we cannot administer medication at multiple times throughout the day for different children. Therefore, if your child requires medicine three times per day, we would expect this to be administered at home. However, if your child is at school club, then we will support administering medication before going to school club. Some medication is prescribed four times a day therefore, if your child requires four lots of medication then we will administer one dose at 11am, the other doses will be given at home unless they go to school club.
